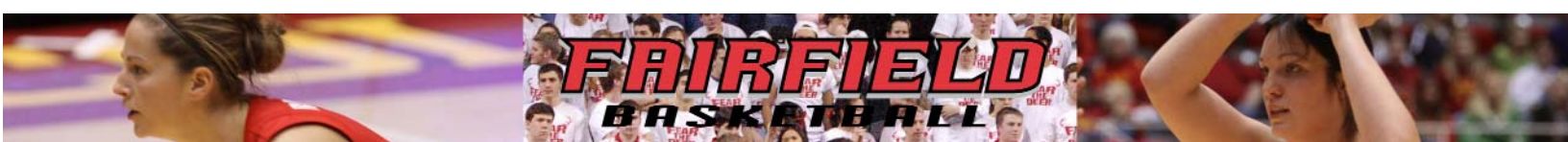

## **DIRECTIONS**

### **THE ARENA AT HARBOR YARD:**

#### **From 1-95 Southbound:**

Take exit 27 (Lafayette Boulevard). Bear left going down the ramp. Turn left onto Lafayette. Go under 1-95, and take the far left onto Frontage Road (do not take the other left onto the ramp for 1-95N). Go one block & Arena is on right.

#### **From I-95 Northbound**

Take Exit 27 (Lafayette Blvd.). At the bottom of the ramp continue straight along South Frontage Road past Lafayette Blvd. Go through the light and the Arena is directly in front of you.

### **ALUMNI HALL:**

#### **From 1-95 Southbound**

Take Exit 22 and turn right onto North Benson Rd. Follow to main entrance. At first stop sign turn left and the parking lot will be on the right at bottom of small hill.

#### **From I-95 Northbound**

Take Exit 22 (Round Hill Road) which is also an exit for a rest area. Stay right on the exit, continue straight through the stop sign until traffic light. Turn left onto North Benson Rd. Continue to Main Entrance. At first stop sign turn left and the parking lot will be on the right at bottom of small hill.

### **Visiting Radio**

All visiting radio stations must make arrangements to broadcast by calling the Sport Information Office. Phone lines are available for a fee, however reciprocal phone line agreements are available. MAAC schools will be provided with one complimentary phone line.

### **Locker Room Policy**

The Fairfield University women's basketball locker room is not open to the media before or after a game. However, a member of the Sports Information staff will bring requested players outside the locker room or to the media interview room following a game. We appreciate your cooperation.

### **Press Row**

Members of the media will be seated at press row on a space availability basis. In most cases, any reporter who is issued a credential will be allotted a seat at press row or in the auxiliary press box. Radio stations which broadcast the game will be located on press row.

### **Parking**

Media parking is available on a very limited basis at the Arena at Harbor Yard. No parking lot is designated for media. If you need to make special arrangements regarding parking, please contact Chris O'Connor well in advance of game day. All parking matters are at the discretion of the Arena. For games at Alumni Hall, enter campus at the main gate and make your first left. Parking is at the bottom of the small hill on the right.

### **Media Credentials**

In order to eliminate any misunderstanding, all Media Credential requests must be made 72 hours in advance of a home basketball game. Because of limited space, priority will be given to outlets that cover the participating teams on a regular basis. Credentials will be available at the media entrance on game day. To secure credentials, please call Chris O'Connor at (203) 254-4000 x2878.

### **Photo Credentials**

A photo pass is required to take any photos at the Arena at Harbor Yard and Alumni Hall. Photographers may secure photo passes by contacting Chris O'Connor at least 48 hours before game time. Photographers are NOT PERMITTED in the team bench area. Photos may be taken from the base line in the designated photo box. Space is allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.

### **Media Services**

Complete statistics and running play-by-play will be provided approximately 20 minutes after the game in the media room. Post-game interviews will be conducted in the media room after the NCAA required 10-minute cooling off period.

### **Post-Game News Conference**

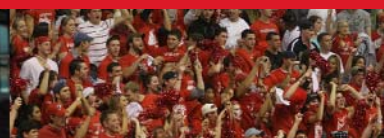
Following each game, Head Coach Joe Frager and select players will be available for a post-game news conference in the designated area. The visiting head coach and select players will be escorted to the post-game news conference first, followed by Fairfield University. One-on-one interviews can be arranged after games through the Sports Information Office. Please contact Chris O'Connor for any post-game needs.

### **Coach & Player Interviews**

All interview requests must be made through the Sports Information Office. The preferred interview time is 60 minutes before practice for coaches and 30 minutes before practice for players. Player phone numbers will not be released at any time. Please make interview requests at least 24 hours in advance.

### **Media Room**

A media room is located on court level. The room is for media ONLY. Food and beverages will be served one hour before a single game or between games of a double-header. Game notes and stats are available in this room. Reporters are welcome to write and send stories from this room. Phone lines are available for sending stories on a first-come, first-served basis.



Fairfield University basketball continues to offer fans in the local area, around the nation, and around the world, numerous opportunities to track the Stags. Fans can gain access to the Stags via radio, television and internet throughout the year.

### FairfieldStags.com

Fairfield University launched its redesigned website - [www.FairfieldStags.com](http://www.FairfieldStags.com) - in August, 2010. The website is hosted by ICS, a leading provider of athletic website design and hosting, which offers innovative web solutions for colleges and universities throughout the country. The Fairfield University website provides fans with multimedia experiences such as audio streaming, live stats, and feature stories.



### Television

Fairfield basketball has enjoyed a tradition of local, regional and national coverage by the electronic media. Since 1986, the Stags have made 10 appearances on ESPN, more than 30 on the Madison Square Garden (MSG) Network, and have appeared on SportsChannel more than 15 times, as well as on a variety of other local television networks.



In addition, the Department of Athletics has announced that the Stags Feb. 21 game versus Siena, at the Arena at Harbor Yard, will air statewide on WCTX, My9. In conjunction with the University's media center, which has produced games in each of the past two seasons, My9 will broadcast the game live.

The Stags also appear on the MSG Network and ESPNU as part of the MAAC's television package. This season the Stags game at Loyola on January 14 is set to air live on ESPNU, with the MAAC Championships semifinals airing on the MSG Network. In addition, the MAAC Championship Game will air nationally in over 73 million homes on ESPNU.

### Streaming Video

Fairfield will once again offer video webstreaming of its home contests. All of the Stags 15 home games this season will be available online through a partnership with Stretch Internet. Fans that access the video feed will get the best of both worlds, as they listen to the call of the Stags radio broadcast team and watch the action live. Packages are available for fans to watch all home sporting events that are web-cast, as well as packages for watching only home basketball games, or fans can purchase on a game-by-game basis.



### Radio

Fairfield women's basketball will also once again have all of its regular and postseason games broadcast on the airwaves on WVOF 88.5 FM. John Cummings will provide the play-by-play and will be joined by primary color analyst Maria Conlon.



Fans from around the world can hear the call of each of the Stags games because of the basketball networks internet broadcasting capability. By visiting FairfieldStags.com fans can access the internet feed. Windows Media Player or Quicktime software is required to listen to the broadcast.

### On-Air Talent

**John Cummings** enters his 17th season as the play-by-play announcer for the women's basketball team and as the men's basketball color analyst.

Cummings came to Fairfield from Marist College, where he announced Red Foxes football for four years.

He was a decorated officer with the New York City Police Department, where he served the city for eight years. He currently teaches social studies at Saint Raymond High School for Boys in the Bronx.

He resides in New City, N.Y. with his wife Denise and two sons Nicholas (17) and Matthew (15).

**Maria Conlon** is in her fourth season as the primary color analyst for the Fairfield University women's basketball team. Conlon was an assistant coach for Joe Frager at Southern Connecticut State University during the 2006-07 National Championship run, and played for him at Seymour High School.

A standout at the University of Connecticut, Conlon helped the Huskies to three national titles during her career. She was one of two players to see action in all 70 of the Huskies' 70-game winning streak.

**Fourth Season at Fairfield \* 60-36 (.625)**  
**13th Season as a Head Coach \* 249-119 (.677)**

Now in his fourth season as the head coach of the Fairfield University women's basketball team, Joe Frager has the Stags back in the conversation among the top Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) programs. Over his first three years at the helm Frager has led the Stags to

a 60-36 record, a berth in the MAAC Championship Game in 2010 and the program's first-ever national postseason tournament victory.

Frager led the Stags to their second 20-win seasons in three-years during the 2009-10 campaign, culminating in a nine-game win streak that placed Fairfield into its first MAAC title game since 2001. After a hard-fought loss to Marist College, the Stags received a bid to the inaugural Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI). In the opening round of the tournament Fairfield hosted - and defeated - Towson University for the program's first national postseason tournament home game and victory. It marked the eighth time in Fairfield history that the Stags reached the 20-win plateau.

All told, Frager has been a head coach at the collegiate level for a dozen years, with nine seasons at Southern Connecticut State University, and boasts a career record of 249-119. His resume includes the 2007 NCAA Division II National Championships and six Coach of the Year awards. Outside of being honored for an individual season's accomplishments, Frager has also been honored for the breadth of his achievements. In 2008 he was inducted into the Connecticut Women's Basketball Hall of Fame and in October 2009 was inducted into the New England Basketball Hall of Fame.

The first three seasons of Frager's tenure at Fairfield has rekindled the spirit and tradition of the Stags women's basketball program. On January 23, 2009, Frager coached the Stags to their first-ever win over a nationally-ranked team. In front of a national television audience, live on ESPNU, the Stags knocked off #20 Marist College 73-65 in overtime, and in the process snapped the Red Foxes 37-game home conference win streak.

The Stags are averaging 20 victories a season in Frager's tenure, have finished in third

place in the MAAC each year, and have advanced to at least the MAAC Championship semifinal in every campaign. Stag players are also receiving acclaim under his tutelage, highlighted by Stephanie Geehan being named the MAAC Defensive Player of the Year in 2010, after setting the conference record for career blocks.

Geehan became the third Stag in as many years under Frager to earn All-MAAC First Team accolades; joining Sabra Wrice (2008) and Baendu Lowenthal (2009). The trio of players were also all recognized by the Metropolitan Basketball Writer's Association with All-MET honors, as Geehan became the first player since 2001 to be named to the organizations top team. Fairfield has also had two players earn All-MAAC Rookie Team honors in the last two years. Desiree Pina, an All-MAAC Third Team selection this season, was named to the team in 2009 and Katelyn Linney was recognized following the 2010 campaign.

Under Frager, Stag players have had great success in the classroom and in basketball. All 10 student-athletes in his first three Fairfield seasons have graduated, with five of those players going on to professional playing careers. Tara Flaherty (Croatia) and Stephanie Geehan (Luxembourg) both signed contracts after completing the



Stags 2010 postseason run. In the previous two seasons; Baendu Lowenthal (Spain), Meka Werts (Finland) and Sabra Wrice (England) continued their playing careers after spending time under Frager's tutelage.

Frager's first season at the helm of the Stags, the 2007-08 campaign, can only be considered a rousing success. Fairfield won 22 games, including five straight to start the season, and knocked off ACC member Boston College earning strong consideration for an at-large berth to the WNIT. The win total was the fourth-most victories in a single-season in the program's history. It also marked the seventh-time in program history that the Stags had won 20 or more games, and the first time since the 2000-01 squad earned an at-large berth to the NCAA Tournament. The squad fulfilled Frager's goal of playing well down the stretch, winning 12 of the final 16 games, including five of six to finish the regular season.

The Stags captured 18 victories during the 2008-09 campaign, including a 12-6 mark in league play. The league win total was one more than the 11 the Stags captured during Frager's debut season and was good for a second consecutive third place finish in the conference regular season standings. The team rattled off an eight-game winning streak from mid-January through mid-February, the longest such streak for the program since 2000-01, and included a 7-2 mark in the month of January.

Frager was named the program's fifth-head coach, and second at the Division I level, on April 18, 2007, coming to the Stags after a nine-year stint at Southern Connecticut State University. Over the course of his tenure at SCSU, Frager built the Owls into a Division II powerhouse, culminating in the 2007 National Championship and an impressive nine-year record of 189-83. That 2006-07 squad set a school record, posting a 34-2 record, including a 20-0 start and an 11-game winning streak through postseason play.

Frager earned instant recognition in his first year as a collegiate coach, the 1998-99 season at Southern, earning New England Collegiate Conference co-coach

of the year accolades. He was honored after leading the Owls to an 18-win season, and the program's first postseason berth since 1985, qualifying for the ECAC Championship.

It was the first of many personal awards that Frager would earn during his tenure at Southern Connecticut. He was named the Northeast-10 Conference coach of the year each of his last three years at SCSU. Frager received recog-

nition from the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) in 2005 and 2006, being named the Region I coach of the year. After capturing the 2007 National Championship, Frager earned the Molton/Women's D-II Bulletin National Coach of the Year award.

The 1999 postseason berth was the first of many for Frager, who coached the Owls to four NCAA Tournament berths, and a spot in the conference championship in each of his nine seasons. In each of his four NCAA Tournament appearances, Frager's squads have picked up at least one win, and he boasts a 9-3 NCAA Tournament record. The first NCAA Tournament win of his coaching career came with a 66-63 over UMass-Lowell at

the end of the 2002-03 campaign.

The 2003-04 season saw the Owls win 19 games and fall just short of an NCAA Tournament berth. Frager's team still had an impact on the national standings however, winning the statistical national title for scoring defense for the first time.

Frager's Owls wasted no time in returning to the 20-win plateau and postseason play. The 2004-05 season saw Frager lead the Owls to a 25-6 overall record and an 18-4 mark in Northeast-10 play. Frager's Owls, who finished the year ranked 21st nationally, defeated Pace, 55-33, in the NCAA Northeast Regional to cap off the season.

A year later, Frager's squad posted a SCSU record 29 wins, and advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the second straight year. The team captured the NE-10 regular season and tournament titles on the way to a final national ranking of 14th. And for the second time in three years, the Owls were the statistical national champions in scoring defense.

Frager's road to Fairfield began in 1987 when he was named the head varsity girls basketball coach at Seymour High School. Over the next 11 seasons his teams compiled an impressive 208-58 record, for a winning percentage of .782, and three state titles. Frager found a winning way at Seymour, with 11 straight appearances in the CIAC tournament and eight consecutive trips to the quarterfinals or beyond. His charges put together a winning streak of 52 straight games during the 1996-97 and 1997-98 seasons, with identical 26-0 records,

and a pair of state titles. Frager led the Wildcats to the first state title in 1993.

A native of Shelton, Conn., Frager earned a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science from the University of Connecticut in 1984. In 1994 he earned a Master's Degree in Social Sciences from SCSU.

Frager, and his wife Shirley, reside in Southbury, Conn., with their sons, Brendan (16), and Kevin (13).

### Q & A WITH HEAD COACH JOE FRAGER

**What is the key to your coaching success?** To surround yourself with good, loyal, dependable people - players, coaches, athletic trainers, etc. I've always tried to recruit talented athletic student-athletes who are quality people. Personally, I'd like to think that I was raised with a strong work ethic by my father and my coaches. I am very detail oriented and try to never allow anyone to outwork the teams I have been associated with. When you are competitive and hate to lose, you try to do anything within the rules to prevent that from happening. Ultimately, without the support I receive from my wife, Shirley, and sons, Brendan and Kevin, nothing is possible.

**What does Fairfield University offer to student-athletes?** Fairfield University offers student-athletes a tremendous opportunity. It offers them an opportunity to grow, an opportunity to learn, and an opportunity to compete at an outstanding University. Fairfield's mission is not to educate just the mind, but to nurture our students' growth as complete human beings. If a student-athlete is looking for a beautiful campus, great facilities and an outstanding supportive faculty and campus community, Fairfield is home.

**What are your goals for the women's basketball program at Fairfield?** We want our program to compete in the upper tier of the MAAC and put ourselves in a position to compete for and win MAAC Championships, which equates to NCAA Tournament appearances. We also want to be respected for doing things the right way. It is

important that we represent Fairfield University in the proper fashion in all aspects.

**What is your coaching philosophy?** I believe in building the foundation of a team around solid half-court team defense. To create a sense of interdependence on the team where a player does not want to let down her teammate or coaches. The teamwork that we build on the defensive end, we want to carry over to offense. Offensively, we want to be opportunistic, unselfish, and be a team that executes extremely well.

**What type of student-athlete are you looking to recruit?** We are looking to recruit talented student-athletes that want to be part of contributing to and building something special. We are also looking for student-athletes who are serious about their academic commitment. We will recruit highly competitive, team-oriented individuals who hate to lose.

### LAURA SCINTO Fourth Season

Laura Scinto is now in her fourth year as a member of the Fairfield University women's basketball coaching staff. In addition to her role as the Stags recruiting coordinator, she coordinates each of the team's scouting reports and assists in the planning and implementation of the Stags practice and game plans.

Scinto is now in her 15th season alongside Fairfield head coach Joe Frager including his entire nine-year stint at Southern Connecticut State University. During her time with the Owls, Scinto played an integral part in the 2007 National Title, as well as the team's four NCAA Tournament appearances.

For the two years prior to making the move with Frager to SCSU, Scinto was his assistant at Seymour High School. She led the squad to three NCAA Tournament appearances, while scoring over 1,000 points, and earning academic all-conference honors. Scinto went on to earn A.S. and R.N. degrees from St. Vincent's College of Nursing.

### HEATHER EZELL First Season

Heather Ezell is in her first season as an assistant coach with the Fairfield University women's basketball program. In her role as assistant coach, Ezell's primary responsibility will be the development of the Stags perimeter players, as well as assisting in the program's recruiting efforts and practice and game planning. In addition, she will oversee the team's community service projects and film exchange program.

Ezell spent 2009-10 in Iceland playing for Haukar in the Iceland Express League, where she was named the Best Player. She led the league in points and steals, while finishing second in assists and rebounds, and earning the MVP award in the league's All-Star Game.

A 2009 graduate of Iowa State University, Ezell graduated with degrees in management and marketing, and with four varsity letters. She tied the Cyclones career record with 287 career made three-point field goals and 10th in program history with 1,339 points. An All-Big 12 Second Team selection as a senior, Ezell finished that season ranked 27th in the nation with 2.5 three-point field goals made per game and ranked eighth in the Big 12 with 3.5 assists a contest.

Ezell was the only player who did not play in the 2009 Big 12 Championship title game to earn all-tournament team honors. She earned that accolade after draining a conference record 17 three-pointers in three tournament games, including a record eight in an upset of top-seeded Kansas State.

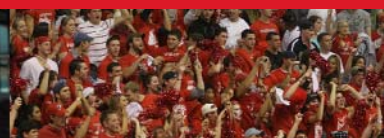

# Meet The Stags



For the third time in as many seasons the Fairfield University women's basketball team enters a campaign without its leading scorer returning from the previous year. Unlike last season however, the 2010-11 squad has two players returning that scored in double-digits a year ago, among its game-tested veteran group.

The Stags return eight players from last season's 20-win team - but have just one scholarship senior - two total - on the roster. Among the returning players however are six student-athletes that started at least twice during the program's 2009-10 season, which culminated in the team's first postseason berth since 2001. Of those six players, four started at least 16 games, and two - Desiree Pina and Katelyn Linney - started all 34 games.

All told, Fairfield returns two-thirds (1,304-1,973) of its scoring from a season ago, including Taryn Johnson, who shot an impressive 45.5 percent from the floor during her sophomore campaign. The junior is also the team's top returning rebounder, having finished last season with 234 caroms. The Stags, who averaged 37 boards a game, return 60.5 percent of that rebounding.

Fourth-year head coach Joe Frager also welcomes four newcomers to the fold. The quartet gives the Stags an influx of size - all are 5-foot-10 or taller - and wide variety of on-floor attributes that will help replenish the Stags roster.

## BACKCOURT

The Stags backcourt is six players strong, but has just one player that is a junior by eligibility. That one player, Desiree Pina, will be the focal point for the Stags offense, after averaging 12.1 points per game a year ago - good for seventh in the MAAC. She was named to the All-MAAC Third Team for her efforts in being the team's second leading scorer. Pina will continue in the combo-guard role that she excelled in last season seeing time at both the point and shooting-guard position.

Penciled in as the Stags starting two-guard a year ago Pina became the team's primary point guard following Sarah Paulus' knee injury. In that role, Pina handed out a team-best 98 assists and put together an assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.2, just missing out on qualifying among the top-five in the MAAC in that category. Her 2.88 assists per game was good for eighth in the league. Pina finished second on the team with 412 points, including hitting 75.4 percent of her free throws - the seventh best total percentage in the conference.

Pina also proved her fitness last year, starting all 34 games in which the team

played. Her 38.1 minutes a game - which increased to 38.5 a game in league play - ranked first in the MAAC and among the top-10 in the nation.

Sarah Paulus, a junior academically, is expected to return to the Stags line-up where she left it last season - as the team's primary point guard. Paulus handed out six assists last season before tearing her ACL minutes into the fourth game of the year. After nearly a full year of rehabilitation, Paulus is back and ready to go. Along with her ball handling skills, Paulus is a cerebral player that is a valuable asset in the Stags complex offensive set, and giving Frager an additional offensive weapon and deep threat.

Also returning with a full season of collegiate basketball under her belt is Katelyn Linney. Just a sophomore, Linney, who has already played over 1,200 minutes in a Stag uniform, has emerged as one of the top three-point shooting threats in the league. Her 2.0 makes per game from behind the arc was third best among MAAC players. She finished the year with 67 three-point field goals, which is the third most in a single-season in program history.

Linney burst onto the season with an 18-point performance at Rhode Island, her collegiate debut, and proceeded to score in double-digits 18 additional times that season. She netted a career-high 22 points at Saint Peter's and twice knocked down 5-8 from behind the arc. Linney finished her rookie campaign with 66 assists and 31 steals, both good for third on the Stags roster.

With a relatively young back court, senior Kelly Romano could be one of the more important pieces of the puzzle this season. Selected as a team captain, Romano brings a strong work ethic to the program on a daily basis that is an example for the younger Stags. When on the floor in game action, her veteran, heady demeanor will give Frager a calming influence for the Stags - young and old alike - to lean on.

Some of that youth will be found in the addition of Christelle Akon-Akech and Alexys Vazquez. Vazquez gives the Stags another threat from behind the line, coming to Fairfield with six scholastic three-point records, including the career mark of 212 makes. She has also shown the ability to handle the ball well and gives Frager an additional ball-handling talent. Akon-Akech will see most of her time on the wing, but will lend her talents to the point guard rotation as well.



### WINGS

On the wings the Stags will look for a reprise of last year's breakout campaigns from both Joelle Nawrocki and Taryn Johnson. Both players stepped into starting spots for a portion of the season and will continue to need to do so for the Stags to have a successful 2010-11 campaign.

Nawrocki, a senior, emerged from the shadow of veteran starters over first two years with the Stags and stepped into a prominent role last year. Now with 16 starts to her credit, and having appeared in all 34 games last season, Nawrocki fills the role of veteran. An athletic wing player, Nawrocki shown in all facets of the game as she averaged over 27 minutes a contest. Her versatility makes her a tough match-up for opposing teams, as she can rebound, shoot and distribute the ball.

Akon-Akech is another versatile player that has the athleticism to play a variety of positions, but her primary spot will be on the wing. She has experience playing a variety of positions and has both the ball-handling and leaping ability to continue to do so at the collegiate level. Akon-Akech is no stranger to Fairfield either, as she is the niece of former Stag men's player Ajou Deng.

Johnson came into her own during her sophomore campaign that saw her start 24 of the Stags final 25 games and will be slotted right back into the starting spot at power forward. Johnson averaged 9.6 points in the 24 games she started. For the year, her playing time tripled from her freshman season, and the Stags saw her nearly quadruple her offensive output, putting up 302 total points, and finished 28th in the league at 8.9 per game.

Arguably among the league's top leapers, Johnson pulled down 6.9 rebounds per game, good for eighth in the MAAC. She also has continued to develop as a shot blocker, swatting 53 during her sophomore season, and enters the 2010-11 season ninth on the Stags career list in that category with 75.

Pushing Johnson for playing time will be sophomore Brittany MacFarlane, who appeared in 31 games during her rookie campaign. At 6-foot-1 she is a presence in the post and stretches the opponents defense with her shooting range. She averaged 1.6 points and 1.8 rebounds last season, while handing out 19 assists.

Fragher will also look for Katie Cizynski, a 6-foot-2 rookie, to compete for playing time during the year. An All-America nominee her senior season, she averaged a double-double over the course of her scholastic career.

### CENTER

The competition for playing time at center will be between sophomore Laura Vetra and newcomer Brittany Obi-Tabot. Vetra saw action in 21 games a season ago scoring 14 points and pulling down 15 boards. A strong back-to-basket player Vetra's international playing experience is a beneficial addition to the Stags roster.

Obi-Tabot, who was named to the *Boston Globe* and *Boston Herald* All-Scholastic Teams, averaged a double-double for her scholastic career. She was a McDonald's All-America nominee following a senior season that saw her average nearly 21 points and over 14 rebounds.

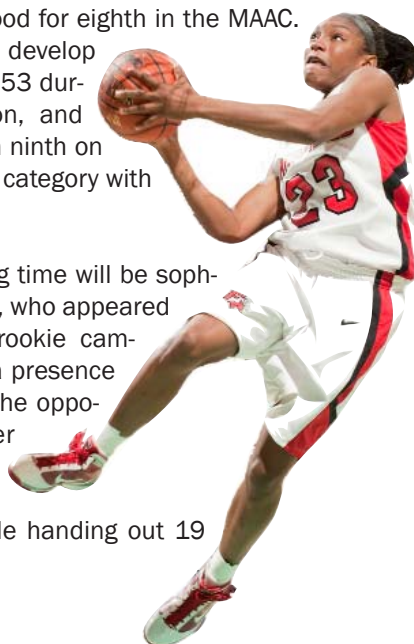
### THE SCHEDULE

The Stags have a 29-game regular season slate in preparation for the 2011 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) Championship, which will be played at the Arena at Harbor Yard, March 3-7. For just the second time in conference history the league's title game will be aired nationally, as the Monday afternoon tilt will be available in over 74 million homes on ESPNU.

The Stags will make a regular season appearance on ESPNU as well, travelling to Loyola on January 14. Fairfield's home finale comes on February 21, when the Stags host Siena at the Arena at Harbor Yard. That game will be televised locally, on MyTV9, in a production of Fairfield University Athletics and the Fairfield Media Center.

The 11-game non-conference slate begins with four consecutive home games at Alumni Hall. Fairfield will host Cornell on November 19 at the on campus facility in the program's 1,000 varsity game. Fairfield also resumes a series with Big East member Villanova, travelling to Philadelphia on December 2. The Stags final non-conference game comes December 28 at N.C. State of the ACC.

Of the Stags 15 home games, 12 will be at the on-campus arena, beginning on November 12 when Quinnipiac visits. That game marks the return of Fairfield University Alumni Association Hall of Fame member Tricia (Sacca) Fabbri. The Stags will host three games at the Arena at Harbor Yard this winter, beginning February 6 when defending MAAC champion Marist visits. Fairfield will also host Loyola and Siena at the Arena.

With 10 institutions strongly bound by the sound principles of quality and integrity in academics and excellence in athletics, the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference is in its 30th year of competition during the 2010-2011 academic year.

The MAAC was founded in 1980 by six charter members: the U.S. Military Academy, Fairfield, Fordham, Iona, Manhattan and Saint Peter's. Competition followed one year later in the fall of 1981 with members competing in the sports of men's cross country and men's soccer. On January 2, 1982, Army traveled to Iona for the first MAAC men's basketball game and the MAAC story had begun.

Today, Conference members include: Canisius, Fairfield, Iona, Loyola, Manhattan, Marist, Niagara, Rider, Saint Peter's, and Siena. In addition, associate members include Detroit Mercy, Jacksonville, Virginia Military Institute, St. Francis (N.Y.), Villanova, Wagner, Drake, Robert Morris, Sacred Heart, Albany, Boston and Hartford, compete in lacrosse, rowing, water polo and women's golf. The MAAC will support 24 sports and championships during the 2010-11 academic year.

The MAAC Basketball Championships return to the Arena at Harbor Yard in Bridgeport, Conn. for 2011, with Springfield's MassMutual Center preparing to host the 2012-14 championships. By having an excellent working relationship with various facilities, the MAAC has been able to attract a number of NCAA Championship events. Most recently, the MAAC, Canisius and Niagara successfully hosted the 2010 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship First and Second Rounds at the HSBC Arena in Buffalo, N.Y. All three parties hosted the event in 2004 and 2007. The MAAC and Rider co-hosted the 2009 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship Regional at the Sovereign Bank Arena in Trenton, N.J., after recording the third highest attendance figure for the women's championship with the First and Second Rounds in 2006. The MAAC and Rider will work together to co-host the 2011 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships at the Wells Fargo Center in Philadelphia, Pa.

In June of 1995, the MAAC continued to develop opportunities for student-athletes as the conference announced the formation of the MAAC Men's and Women's Lacrosse Leagues. The men's league began competition in the spring of 1996, while the women's league commenced in the spring of 1997. In 2002, the MAAC added the MAAC Women's Water Polo League. The league is made up of three MAAC schools as well as three associate members.

Sacred Heart started participating in MAAC Women's Rowing in the spring of 2008. Drake joined the league for the 2010 MAAC Championship, while Robert Morris will begin competition in the spring of 2011.

In the summer of 2009, the MAAC added three associate members to women's golf, with the programs starting competition against MAAC members in 2009-2010.

The MAAC prides itself on the accomplishments of its stu-



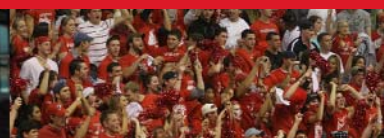
dent-athletes in the classroom, as well as on the field. Mary Beth Riley, a 1991 graduate of Canisius, was the first recipient of the NCAA Woman of the Year Award. In the fall of 1998, Erin Whalen, a member of the Iona women's rowing team, was awarded one of the nation's 32 Rhodes Scholarships for academic achievement and civic leadership. Jose Vargas, a Loyola student, was also awarded a Rhodes Scholarship in 1999.

First-class facilities are the rule with MAAC schools, as teams regularly play in top-notch arenas, such as Madison Square Garden, the IZOD Center, HSBC Arena, Times Union Center, the Arena at Harbor Yard and the Sun National Bank Center. The other MAAC championships boast their share of outstanding locales as well, such as the Reverend Harold Ridley, S.J., Athletic Complex at Loyola, where both the men's and women's soccer championships will be contested in the fall of 2010, and Waterfront Park in Trenton, home of the 2011 MAAC Baseball Championship. This year, the MAAC will take its volleyball championship to Orlando, Florida, where it will conduct its post-season event at the ESPN Wide World of Sports Complex. The MAAC Men's and Women's Golf Championships will be held at Disney's Magnolia Golf Course.

In the past several years, a number of the MAAC schools have also enjoyed success in NCAA Championships. MAAC schools have made a total of 75 NIT appearances and 45 NCAA appearances. In addition, Fairfield represented the league last season in the CollegenInsider.com Postseason Tournament while the Fairfield women participated in the Women's Basketball Invitational. The MAAC currently possesses 13 automatic bids to NCAA Championships in men's and women's basketball, baseball, softball, men's and women's soccer, volleyball, men's golf, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's lacrosse, and women's water polo. In 2007, the Marist women's basketball team advanced to the Sweet 16 before falling to the eventual National Champion, Tennessee. Last fall, the No. 11 Iona men's cross country team finished tied for eighth place at the NCAA Championship race, extended the Gaels' streak to eight straight Top 10 national finishes. Canisius softball, Manhattan track, Manhattan and Marist baseball and Loyola soccer and lacrosse have also flourished on the national stage.

The MAAC has also been a leader in the forefront of technology, expanding the notoriety of the league into cyberspace. In 2007, the league reached an agreement with JumpTV, Inc. to sponsor the MAAC web page. Launched in November 1999, [www.maacsports.com](http://www.maacsports.com) has been a great success, providing fans with up-to-date contest results, multimedia content and an online merchandise store.

The MAAC President for the 2010-2011 academic year is Rev. Jeffrey von Arx, S.J., the President of Fairfield. The Vice-President is Dr. Eugene J. Cornacchia, Ph.D., the President of Saint Peter's. Ed McLaughlin, Director of Athletics at Niagara, will chair the Committee on Athletic Administration, and Karin Torchia, Associate Athletic Director/Senior Woman Administrator at Rider will serve as Vice Chair.

# 2009-10 Review



**Season Recap:** Fairfield finished the 2009-10 season with a 20-14 record, advanced to the MAAC Championship Final, and played in the Women's Basketball Invitational. The 34 games played is the most games any Stag team has played in a single-season.

**Magic 20:** Fairfield posted its eighth 20-win season last year, going 20-14. It marked the second time under **Joe Frager** that the Stags reached at least 20 victories - compiling 22 wins during the 2007-08 campaign. Fairfield is averaging 20 wins a year under Frager's tutelage.

**Honorees:** Fairfield was well represented at the annual MAAC Awards Press Event, held on the opening day of the championship. **Stephanie Geehan** became the first Stag in program history to earn the league's Defensive Player of the Year award, while also being named to the All-MAAC First Team. **Desiree Pina** was voted to the All-MAAC Third Team, while **Katelyn Linney** was selected to the league's All-Rookie Team.

**Doubley Good:** **Stephanie Geehan** recorded 21 double-doubles during her senior season, a personal best. The total also ranked her second in the NCAA in that category, trailing only the 22 double-doubles of Shanavia Dowdell from Louisiana Tech. She came within a block of a triple-double in the Stags game versus Sacred Heart. Geehan scored 10, had 10 boards and tied a single-game school record with nine blocked shots in that effort.



earned the program's first-ever national postseason win, defeating Towson 69-55 at Alumni Hall. Fairfield ended its season with a 59-36 loss at top-seeded Appalachian State, the eventual tournament champion.

**A Postseason Return:** The Stags were selected to play in the inaugural Women's Basketball Invitational, marking the team's first national postseason berth since 2001. Fairfield was the #5 seed in the East Region of the 16-team event. The Stags

**Deadly From Downtown:** **Katelyn Linney** and **Stephanie Geehan** are the only teammates in program history to both put their names on the single-season made three-point field goal list in the same year. Linney's 67 three-pointers made is third on the list, while Geehan's 51 treys were good for ninth. As a team, the Stags knocked down 162 three-pointers, the most in a season in team history. Fairfield has made at least one three-pointer in each of the 96 games coached by **Joe Frager**, and have one make in 166 consecutive games.



**Passing Pina:** **Desiree Pina** handed out a team-best 98 assists on the year, 2.88 a game, and finished with an assist-to-turnover ratio of 1.2. That number is made even more impressive by the fact that she averaged a league-leading 38.1 minutes per game (38.5 in league games). Pina finished her sophomore campaign second on the team in scoring, at 12.1 points per game.

**Tourney Run:** For the first time since 2001 the Fairfield women's basketball team advanced to the championship game of the MAAC Tournament. Fairfield opened championship play with a 70-56 quarterfinal win over Loyola, behind a 22-point, 16-rebound effort from **Stephanie Geehan**. Geehan again provided the scoring punch, 18 points, in a 61-57 semifinal win over Iona. **Taryn Johnson** hauled in 13 boards, to go along with eight points, while **Desiree Pina** scored 15 in the victory.

is the longest win streak since the 2000-01 team won 10 straight.

**Rookie Leader: Katelyn Linney** scored a game-high 18 points in her collegiate debut at Rhode Island, and is just the fourth rookie in program history to lead the team in scoring in the season opener of their rookie campaign. Her 18 points is also the highest opening-game total of a rookie in the school's Division I history, eclipsing Megan Light's 15-point effort in her 1998 season debut.

**Defensive Effort:** Fairfield equaled one mark and nearly set another with its defensive effort against Lafayette in the home opener. The 29 points that Lafayette scored in the game equals the lowest game total allowed by the Stags at the Division I level. The previous mark was when Fairfield held Iona to 29 points on Jan. 26, 1991. In the first-half, the Stags held the Leopards to 11 points. That is the second-lowest scoring effort by an opponent in a half, as the Stags held Niagara to nine points in the first-half of a January 31, 1997.

**Just Johnson: Taryn Johnson** enjoyed a breakout sophomore season for the Stags. The forward appeared in all 34 games and started 24 of the team's last 25 contests. She finished the year averaging 8.9 points, which was good for fourth on the team, and her 6.9 boards a game was second on the squad. Johnson also began to evolve into a shot blocker, swatting away a career-best 53 shots on the year - second only to Stephanie Geehan. She had her first career double-double with 14 points and 13 boards at Marist. Johnson tallied her first career 20-point effort in the Stags win over Iona, also hauling in 11 boards in the game.

Geehan, 10, Pina, 16, and **Katelyn Linney**, 10, all scored in double figures against Marist in the final, but the Red Foxes shot 47 percent from the field to earn the 66-49 victory.

**Blocking Queen: Stephanie Geehan** became the school and MAAC career blocks leader during her final campaign, finishing with 287 blocks. She swatted a single-season record 118 shots during her senior season, and now owns the top-two single-season blocking efforts in team history. Geehan graduated as only the fourth-player in Stags history to eclipse 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds.

**Preaching Fundamentals:** Defense and taking care of the balls are two of the things that are preached by **Joe Frager** the most. The Stags did both of those things in 2009-10. Fairfield finished the year ranked 29th in the nation in turnovers, committing only 14.9 per game, while ranking 41st in scoring defense, allowing just 57.6 points per game.

**Rookie Scoring: Katelyn Linney** poured in 348 points, third on the team, and fourth on the Stags Division I Freshmen scoring list. She joined **Desiree Pina** on the list, as Pina dropped to ninth with her 271 points during the 2008-09 season.

**Eight Wasn't Enough:** The Stags nine-game win streak, which ended in the championship final is the longest in the three year tenure of **Joe Frager** at Fairfield. The Stags won eight straight games from January 16 through February 8 of last season. It

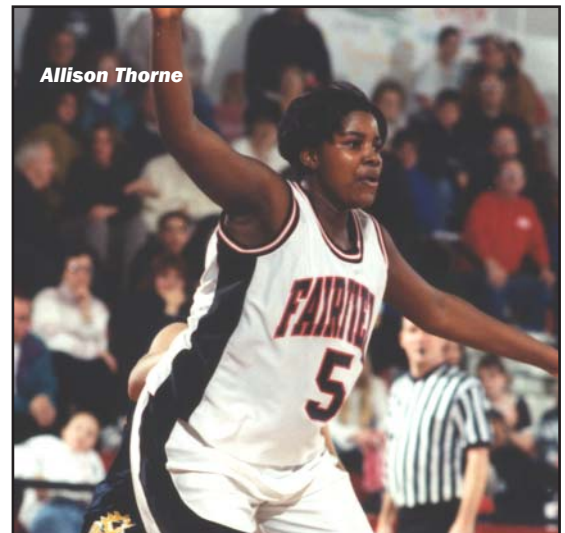
**2010 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL INVITATIONAL  
FIRST-EVER NATIONAL POSTSEASON WIN  
20-14 Overall; 11-7 MAAC**

The Stags made their first postseason appearance in nearly a decade - and came away with the program's first-ever national postseason victory. After giving Marist all it could handle in the MAAC Championship Game, the Stags were rewarded with the fifth-seed in the East Region of the WBI. Fairfield hosted #4 Towson at Alumni Hall, and behind 24-point, 10-rebound **Stephanie Geehan** double-double, earned a 69-55 victory. A quick turn-around, three days, had the Stags in Boone, N.C. where Fairfield fell to the eventual WBI Champion, Appalachian State. For the second time in three seasons the Stags won 20 games in a year, finishing at 20-14, after winning nine straight games from the end of the regular season through the MAAC Championship semifinals. It marked the eighth time in program history, and the second time in three years, that the Stags reached 20 wins in a season. For the third straight year, the Stags finished league play as the three-seed, posting an 11-7 record against MAAC opponents.



**2001 NCAA TOURNAMENT PARTICIPANT  
FIRST-EVER AT-LARGE BERTH  
25-6 Overall; 16-2 MAAC**

The Stags fourth trip to the NCAA Tournament came without winning the MAAC Tournament, as the 2001 Fairfield squad was given a coveted at-large bid by the NCAA Tournament Selection Committee. This was just the third at-large bid in MAAC history, and the first since 1989. A tough non-conference schedule, along with a second-place finish in the MAAC, with a 16-2 conference record, allowed the Stags to go dancing. The number 12 seeded Stags traveled to Salt Lake City, Utah, to square off with the number five seeded Utah Utes. Once again, the Stags NCAA Tournament stay ended after one contest, losing 79-57. They finished the season with a 25-6 record, tying the school record for most victories in a season. There were three seniors on the roster, Gail Strumpf, Holli Tarpley, and Allison Thorne, who graduated as one of the most successful classes in the program's history.



**1999-2000 MAAC REGULAR SEASON CHAMPIONS  
WNIT PARTICIPANT  
25-8 Overall; 15-3 MAAC**

For the second time in three years, the 1999-2000 Stag squad received a postseason bid as Fairfield earned the right to play in the Women's National Invitational Tournament. After a successful regular season, which left them as the number one seed in the MAAC Tournament, the Stags quickly disposed of Canisius in the first round, 74-54 and then squeezed out a 76-73 victory over Siena in the second round. Unfortunately, Fairfield's run came to an end in the championship game as the Stags lost to St. Peter's 61-46. Still, Fairfield was rewarded for an outstanding season with the program's first WNIT berth. The Stags traveled to Madison, Wisc., to take on the Wisconsin Badgers in the first round. Fairfield played their hearts out, with Megan Light tallying a team-high eight points, but the Badgers proved too much to overcome as the Stags were defeated 83-46. The Stags finished the 1999-2000 season with a 25-8 record, tying the school record for most wins in a season.

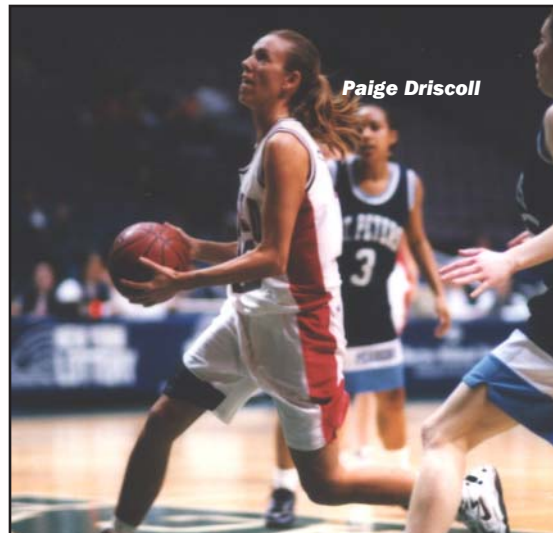

### **1998 MAAC CHAMPIONS NCAA TOURNAMENT PARTICIPANT 20-10 Overall; 14-4 MAAC**

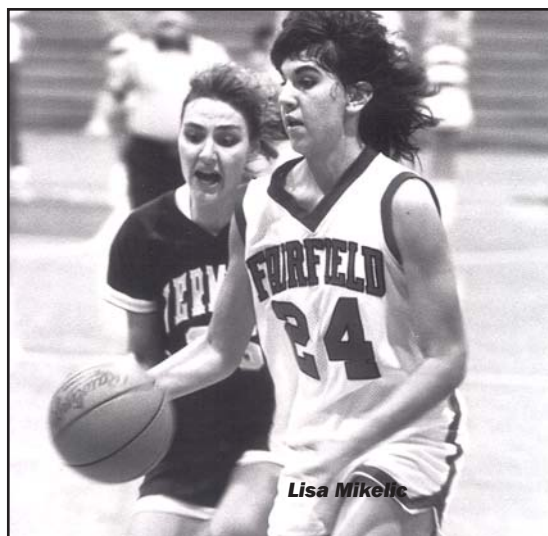
In 1998, Fairfield returned to the NCAA Tournament after a seven-year hiatus. The 1997-98 Stags earned the right to play in the tournament by winning the MAAC championship, defeating Manhattan, St. Peter's, and Loyola. The Manhattan victory showed the Stags perseverance, as they were down 74-67 with 1:19 left in regulation. Senior tri-captain Chantel Williams hit a jumper at the buzzer to send the contest into overtime, where the Stags prevailed, 89-83. Fairfield easily defeated the defending MAAC Champion, St. Peter's in the second round, 64-51. In the MAAC final, senior tri-captain Paige Driscoll scored 17 points, and Gail Strumpf added 10 points and 10 rebounds, giving the Stags a 59-53 victory, and the MAAC Championship. In the first round of the NCAA Tournament, the Stags fell to UConn 93-52, ending the year with a 20-10 record.

### **1991 MAAC CHAMPIONS NCAA TOURNAMENT PARTICIPANT 25-6 Overall; 15-1 MAAC**

For the second time in the program's history, the 1990-91 Stags went tournament dancing. Fairfield coasted through the MAAC regular season, finishing atop the conference with a 15-1 record. In the first round of the MAAC Tournament, the Stags easily dispatched Iona with an 83-59 victory. Manhattan was the opponent in the second round, and they gave Fairfield all they could handle but the Stags squeaked by as Lisa Mikelic scored on a driving lay-up with one second remaining to give Fairfield the 70-68 victory. The championship game proved to be another nail biter but the Stags prevailed over St. Peter's, 80-78. The next step was the NCAA Tournament, where Fairfield was pitted against the host team, Providence College. On paper what looked like a mismatch, turned out to be a thrilling affair, with the Friars sneaking away with an 88-87 victory. This was one of the finest seasons in school history, as the Stags finished with a 25-6 record.

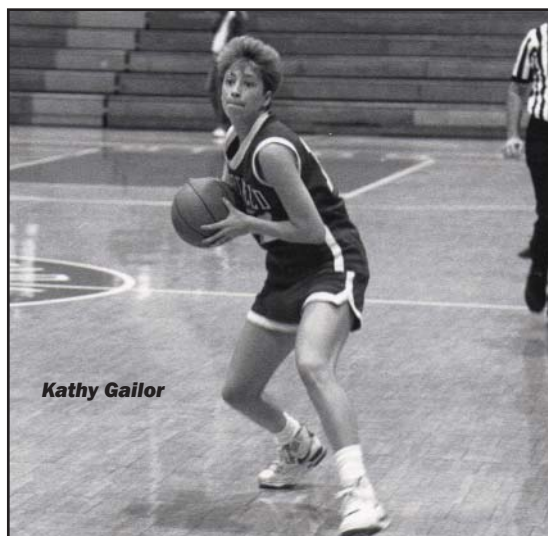

### **1988 MAAC CHAMPIONS FIRST NCAA TOURNAMENT 19-10 Overall; 8-4 MAAC**

The Stags earned their first MAAC Championship and NCAA Tournament berth in 1988. During the MAAC regular-season, the 1987-88 team finished 8-4, which gave them the third seed in the MAAC tournament. In the first round, the Stags easily disposed of Fordham, 80-66. Next up, the Stags crushed the second seed Holy Cross, 86-65. Arch nemesis La Salle was the opponent in the finals. Senior Terry Voegler gave the Stags their first lead of the contest with a ten-foot jumper with 2:04 remaining, and they never looked back, winning 55-50. Fairfield was put into the East Region of the NCAA Tournament, which saw them travel to St. John's University to play the host squad. Fairfield fought hard, but St. John's pulled away with an 83-70 victory. The Stags may have been disappointed with the defeat, but held their heads high after earning the school's first tournament berth, and posting a 19-10 overall record on the season.

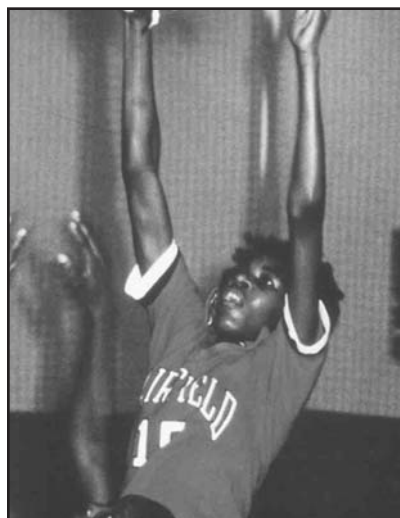
There are only four players in program history that have graduated with over 1,000 points and 1,000 career rebounds. The first player to do so was Katrina Fields, 1981-85, graduating as the program's scoring (1,804) and rebounding leader (1,210). Just six years later Tricia Sacca joined Fields in the elite club, scoring 1,622 points - third at the time - and with 1,037 rebounds. Gail Strumpf, 1997-2001, became the Stags all-time leading scorer during the Stags magical run to an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament during her senior season. Her 1,873 points remains the mark that current Stag players chase. She also hauled in 1,106 rebounds in her four-years, ranking second on that list. And last year, Stephanie Geehan added her name to the list, finishing her playing days with 1,112 points and 1,050 rebounds.

Fairfield University was founded by the Jesuits in 1942, in Fairfield, Conn. It is one of 28 Jesuit universities and colleges in the United States—a school shaped by one of the world's great intellectual, spiritual, and activist traditions. Following the Jesuit tradition, we are committed to educating the whole person - in body, mind, and spirit. By integrating living and learning, we free our students to realize their potential, giving each the confidence, the tools, and the boldness of vision to put their gifts to work in the world. A Fairfield education is an inspiring education, and the foundation for an inspired life.

## Location

Fairfield, overlooking Long Island Sound, is nestled in the southwest corner of Connecticut. It's central location provides students many cultural and social opportunities. Fairfield offers students the best of both worlds - a beautiful suburban setting situated in close proximity to some of the most dynamic corporate environments on the East Coast.

New York City is a mere hour away by car or train while Boston can be reached in under three hours. Fairfield is also 30 minutes away from Stamford, home to the corporate headquarters of dozens of Fortune 500 companies.

The quaint New England shore town of Fairfield has morphed into a lively suburb. It has familiar chain stores but is also home to an independent movie theater, an alternative weekly paper, and excellent restaurants. There are more than 1,000 acres of open space - forest, lakes, rivers - some of which are available for hiking and camping.

## A Fairfield Education

Students transition through four areas of focus as they progress through their four years at Fairfield. Freshman year community development, sophomore year is vocational exploration, junior year is civic engagement, and senior year is discernment.

First-year students find their place in the community, making the adjustment to independent living, looking to advisors and mentors for help, and becoming connected to others. Sophomores begin to focus their studies and ask, "What am I truly passionate about?" Students may choose to live in one of our special learning communities. Juniors consider their role in the larger world - "giving back" through leadership on campus or engagement with the communities beyond. Study abroad

and hands-on learning experiences lay the foundation for growth. By senior year, students enter a period of discernment, reflecting on where their future might lead. Capstone projects, senior retreats, and internships are all part of this process.

Undergraduate course work is grounded in Fairfield's core curriculum, a critical, comprehensive survey of essential knowledge in the major fields of study. Advanced course work often leads to a capstone project, an intensive, yearlong study of a focused topic.

The University's faculty conduct influential research and scholarship, serve as leaders in their fields, and share a commitment to social justice, to education that responds to human needs, and to intellectual inquiry that reaches across disciplinary boundaries. The heart of their work is the relationships they develop with students-as teachers and mentors, advisors, and research partners.

## Campus Life

Campus culture is defined by service and civic engagement, cultural exploration and creative expression, profound reflection and spirited, inspired activity. Approximately 3,300 students from 32 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and 45 countries are enrolled in the University. About 90 percent of Fairfield's students live on campus, making for a strong sense of community.

Fairfield offers a range of housing options, from traditional residence halls to townhouses and apartments. The University also sponsors special interest floors, including a floor for women involved in math and science, and a health and wellness floor. Every residence hall or living area has its own student association and Resident Assistants that are responsible for scheduling a variety of activities.

Students have the opportunity to become involved with more than 80 clubs and organizations, participate in an expansive intramural sports program, enjoy the 20 NCAA Division I varsity athletics programs, and work for an exceptionally active student government. In large numbers, they perform service in local, national, and international communities.

For the performing arts, the Regina A. Quick Center for the Arts, the cultural hub of the campus, hosts a professional season with acclaimed international artists in music, dance, and theater performances in both the acoustically superb 740-seat Kelley Theatre and the 150-seat Wien

Experimental (Black Box) Theatre, and the Thomas J. Walsh Gallery. The Center also hosts many of the other cultural activities presented by various University departments.

The Open VISIONS Forum is Fairfield's renowned public affairs lecture series - a stirring call to live the life of the mind. The series brings to campus the country's most innovative, iconoclastic writers, thinkers, artists, and performers. The goal is to stimulate a more lively, informed, unpredictable public debate. Recent speakers include prize-winning novelist Gore Vidal; former CNN anchor Campbell Brown, author Khaled Hosseini, and Robert F. Kennedy, Jr.

## Study Abroad

The study abroad program gives students a chance to engage – and transform – their understanding of themselves, how people live, and how societies work. Fairfield is proud to sponsor semester-long and short-term programs for every major in such countries as Australia, Ireland, Italy, and Nicaragua. Students have access to affiliated programs in countries around the world, from Chile to China, Ghana to Greece, Thailand to Turkey, including programs at The University of Maastricht in the Netherlands, Sophia University in Japan, and the London School of Economics.

## Service Learning and Community Service

As a Jesuit university, Fairfield is dedicated to being “men and women for others” – not simply students and teachers, but active responsible citizens in pursuit of a just, equitable world. Students can opt to take classes that include service or may develop their own service learning internship or independent study. The result is an experience that integrates theory and practice, action and reflection, civic activism, and serious scholarship.

The Office of Service Learning continues to build on Fairfield's long history of successful community service programs, partnerships with local organizations, and service learning initiatives. More than half of Fairfield's students are engaged in service in local, national, and international communities. For example, the student-run Hunger Cleanup has won several major awards from the National Student Campaign Against Hunger and Homelessness. Fairfield's Campus Ministry sponsors a broad range of volunteer programs: weekly engagements at

local schools and health care facilities, soup kitchens; and national and international service trips to communities in Kentucky and West Virginia, Nicaragua, Jamaica, Ecuador, Haiti, and Mexico.

## Career Planning and Internship Opportunities

The Career Planning Center, located in the Aloysius P. Kelley, S.J. Center, helps students identify and achieve career goals; whether they are graduate school, a year of post-grad service, or an immediate job. The Center offers Career Fairs, job listings, counseling services, specific data on the current job market, workshops on topics such as resume writing, interviewing techniques and personal statements. The Center works with outside organizations and invites them to post job/internship listings and offers them the opportunity to recruit on campus.

The Center works collaboratively with the schools and colleges of the University to provide internship opportunities for undergraduate students. An internship can be completed for academic credit once approved by the major department or school; some internships offer a stipend. Internships should support a student's academic course of study or professional development and training.

While the Center primarily serves undergraduate students, its services are open to all students and graduates of Fairfield. Undergraduates are encouraged to familiarize themselves with and use the Center's services prior to senior year, and graduates are always welcomed back.

## After Fairfield

More than 90 percent of Fairfield's graduates find employment within six months of commencement. Fairfield alumni are also a strong resource available to students. Even after leaving Fairfield, many graduates stay in touch, making themselves available to current students to help them evaluate careers and investigate their options. Through the Fairfield Alumni Network (FAN), sponsored by Alumni Relations, students can call on some 1,400 graduates working in a wide variety of fields who volunteer their time as mentors and advisors.

Fairfield regularly produces more winners of the Fulbright grant, the most prestigious international scholarship awarded by the U.S. Government. Fifty-five Fairfield University students have been awarded Fulbrights since 1993.

## Alumni Hall

Alumni Hall is the on campus home of the Fairfield University volleyball and men's and women's basketball teams. The facility, which opened December 5, 1959, seats 2,400 fans, who were recognized by *Sports Illustrated* for being the most vocal and loyal. In 2007, Alumni Hall was the site of the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) Volleyball Championship. The event was aired live on ESPN.

## Directions to Fairfield

**From Interstate 95 North:** Take Exit 22 (Round Hill Road) which is also an exit for a rest area. Stay right on the exit and proceed to stop sign. Go straight through the stop sign to the end of road. Make left onto North Benson Road. Continue on North Benson Road to Fairfield University Main Entrance and turn left.

**From Interstate 95 South:** Take Exit 22 (North Benson Road). Turn right onto North Benson Road. Follow to Fairfield University main entrance and turn left.

**From Merritt Parkway:** Take Exit 44. Follow Rt. 58 South (Black Rock Turnpike). Proceed two miles to Stillson Road (Rt. 135), where you will see the Angus Steak House on the corner. Turn right onto Stillson and bear left onto North Benson Road at second traffic light. The University's main entrance is one mile on the right.



# Athletic Support Services



## Strength and Conditioning

The Strength and Conditioning Center is a 4,700-square foot facility located in the Walsh Athletic Center for exclusive use by student-athletes. The facility, one of the best in the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC), is designed to meet the changing needs of today's student-athletes and is staffed with a full-time strength and conditioning coach.

A quality strength and conditioning program is an integral part of Fairfield's athletic programs and Head Strength & Conditioning Coach Mark Spellman is responsible for supervising, developing, and implementing workouts for all varsity athletes. Coach Spellman's programs reach team and individual performance goals.

Coach Spellman, a nationally certified conditioning specialist, supervises the University's varsity weight room. His goal is to decrease the potential for injuries while developing athletes who are stronger, faster, more powerful, flexible, and metabolically efficient.

Each year, teams are placed on sport-specific, periodical training programs and Spellman works closely with the Sports Medicine Department to provide individualized attention to athletes who have specific needs or require injury rehabilitation.

## Sports Medicine

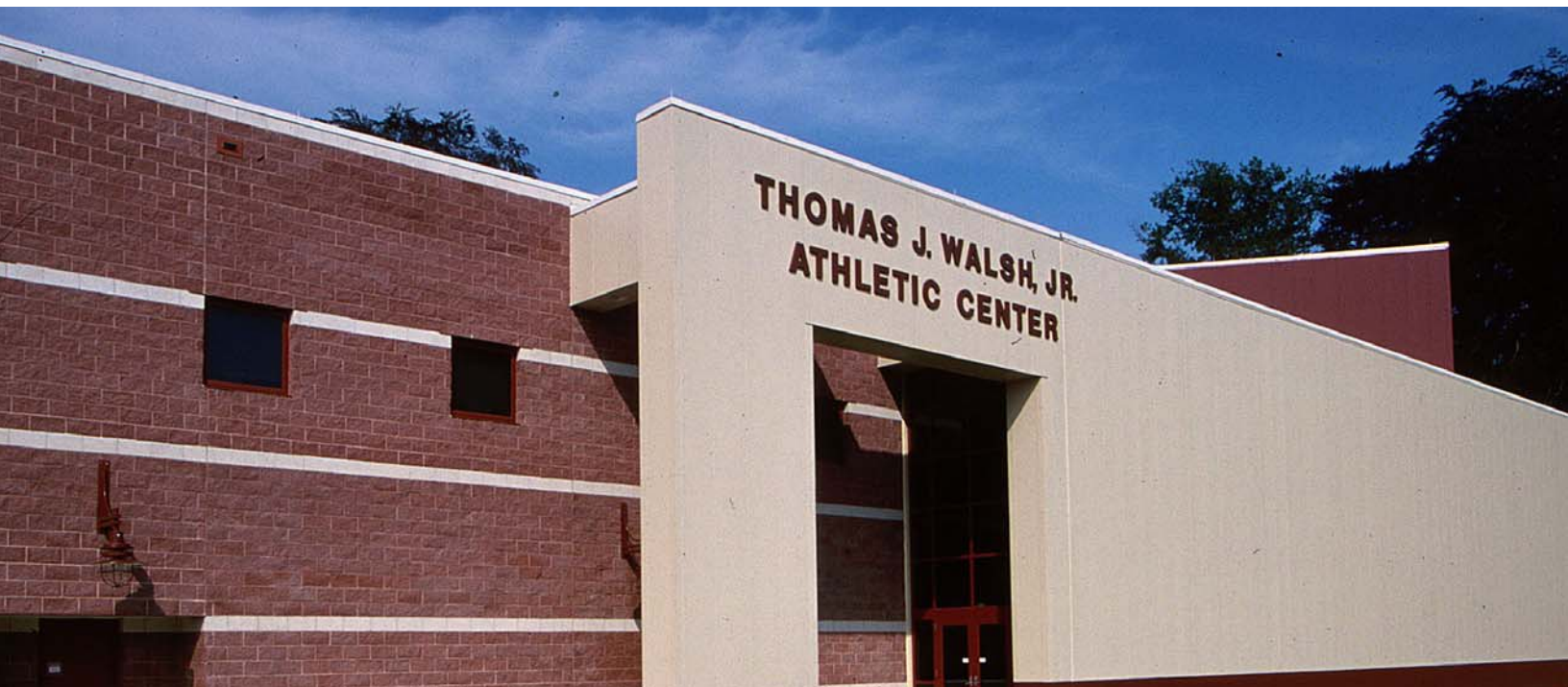
The Sports Medicine Department at Fairfield University is a vital part of the student-athlete experience. The sports medicine facility is located in the Walsh Athletic Center, with a staff comprised of five Nationally Certified Athletic Trainers, including three full-time and two graduate assistant trainers.

Director of Sports Medicine, Mark Ayotte, supervises the day-to-day activities for more than 500 student-athletes in 20 intercollegiate athletic programs. Under his guidance, the sports medicine staff works with student-athletes by providing information and techniques for proper conditioning and nutrition. The staff also supervises and conducts any physical therapy and rehabilitation protocols that a student-athlete may have to follow to safely return to competition.

Additionally, the department has an extensive support staff consisting of a variety of first-rate medical and health professionals. Members of this support staff include: a group of orthopedic physicians, dentists, a plastic surgeon, neurologists, a dermatologist, cardiologists, an ophthalmologist, a sports psychologist, a sports nutritionist and physical therapists. These dedicated individuals provide an invaluable service to injured or ill student-athletes and are readily-available for consultations.

## Thomas J. Walsh, Jr. Athletic Center

Fairfield University's commitment to athletics is best illustrated by the completion of the Thomas J. Walsh, Jr. Athletic Center, a 51,000 square-foot structure that caters to the academic and athletic needs of its student-athletes. Perhaps the building's most significant feature is a high-tech academic study center that is reserved for student-athlete use. The center includes individual and group study areas, computer terminals, hardwire and wireless internet access, a portal to educational systems, and a complete reference library. The building also serves the athlete as well, offering a practice gymnasium for men's and women's basketball as well as volleyball. Plus, all administrative offices and the majority of coaches' offices are located in the Athletic Center, which centralizes the Athletics Department. The first floor contains state-of-the-art locker rooms for all athletic teams, a 4,700 square-foot weight training center, and coaches' locker rooms.



## Academic Support

Fairfield is committed to a strong academic support program for its student-athletes. In 1995, the Athletic Department implemented a new support service designed to meet the unique needs of the college student-athlete. This office and its full-time staff was established to enhance the University through the promotion of the student-athlete's wholesome self concept.

Year-round programs encompass daily academic development as well as career goals and personal growth. The programs provide an academic support system that integrates the use of study halls, tutorials, basic study skills workshops, and personal advising. The support services are tailored to meet the specific needs of each student-athlete.



Mary Ann Palazzi, coordinator of student programs, and her staff of seven, offer services that include guidance and one-on-one counseling on everything from registration to tutoring services.

The Academic Center, located in the Walsh Athletic Center, is reserved for the exclusive use of student-athletes. The room encompasses individual and group study areas, a dozen desktop computers with internet access for research and desktop publishing. In 2006, the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) raised funds to have the center set up with full wireless internet capacity, so student-athletes can use personal laptops.

## Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC)

The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) is a committee made up of student-athletes assembled to provide insight on the student-athlete experience. The SAAC also offers input on the rules, regulations, and policies that affect student-athletes' lives at Fairfield. Each varsity team is represented by at least one student-athlete and may be eligible to serve on the NCAA Student-Athlete Advisory Committee.

Additionally, the SAAC is very involved with giving back to the community. The members participate in the Relay For Life, and sponsor toy drives along with other volunteer work.

## S.T.A.G.S.

The Skills to Achieve Growth and Success (S.T.A.G.S.) program is specially designed to assist student-athletes in their overall development. The S.T.A.G.S. program encompasses an ongoing approach to impart and reinforce the skills necessary to meet the academic rigors of Fairfield University.

# Community Service

In fulfilling the Jesuit ideals of Fairfield University, the Stags are involved in many community service and service learning projects throughout the year. ## Eugene P. Doris

Fairfield Athletics Director (Fordham, 1974)

Fairfield Athletics has flourished under the guidance of Eugene P. Doris, who begins his 16th year as the director of athletics. His responsibilities include overseeing the varsity athletic program.

In 2010, Doris was named the Division I Athletics Director of the Year for the Northeast at the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA). He also received the Distinguished service award from the Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association.

Under his leadership, the varsity athletic program has undergone many changes, including increasing the number of varsity sports to 20 and the improvement of athletic facilities, a softball field, an artificial turf field and the construction of a multi-million dollar athletic facility. Doris has seen the Stags win the overall MAAC Commissioner's Cup twice, while the men have won the Cup twice and the women's teams an impressive five times.

In 2004, Doris received the Constituent Supporter of the Year award from the Coastal Fairfield County Convention and Visitors Bureau for his role in bringing the 2004 NCAA Women's Basketball First and Second rounds to the Arena at Harbor Yard. Doris was also instrumental in securing the 2006 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament Regionals, and the 2007 MAAC Men's and Women's Basketball Tournaments. Fairfield also hosted the 2008 NCAA Women's Basketball Tournament First and Second rounds and played co-host the 2009 and 2011 NCAA Men's Ice Hockey East Regional.

Doris remains active off campus, serving on both regional and national committees, as well as several MAAC committees. He has also served a term as president of the ECAC, the nation's largest athletic conference, and has sat on the Division I-AA Athletic Directors Football Committee.

Prior to Fairfield, Doris was the athletics director at Marist College for five years, during which time Marist increased the number of its intercollegiate athletic teams from 14 to 20. He enjoyed a five-year stay at Fordham University where he started as an assistant athletic director before earning a promotion to associate athletic director. He was also an assistant basketball coach at Fordham under Richard "Digger" Phelps.

He coached basketball for 11 years at Archbishop Stepinac High School in White Plains, N.Y., where his team won the Division II New York Catholic High School Championship in 1985. He also coached baseball at Stepinac for eight seasons, as well as JV baseball at Archbishop Molloy High School in Jamaica, N.Y. In 2007, Doris was inducted into the Catholic High School Athletic Association (CHSAA) Hall of Fame for his contribution to the New York City-based league.

Doris holds a B.A., and an M.A. from Fordham.



## Jeffrey von Arx, S.J.

Fairfield President (Princeton, 1969)

In July 2004, Rev. Jeffrey von Arx, S.J., assumed the presidency of Fairfield University, becoming the eighth Jesuit to hold the position since the institution's founding in 1942.

Fr. von Arx brings to Fairfield broad academic interests, an integrated view of learning, and a zest for student life born of having lived in undergraduate residence halls throughout his years at Georgetown and Fordham. His approach to the intellectual life reflects the best of what Jesuit education offers the world – the integration of knowledge and values as the foundation for unity of mind, body, and spirit.

An historian by discipline, Fr. von Arx began his academic career at Georgetown University, where he taught in the History Department from 1982 to 1998 and was its chair from 1991 to 1997. He then moved into administration at Fordham University, serving as Dean of Fordham College at Rose Hill from 1998 until his selection as president by the Fairfield University Board of Trustees in 2004.

Born in Bellefont, Penn., Fr. von Arx grew up in Locust Valley on the north shore of Long Island. He graduated from Princeton University in 1969 and entered the Society of Jesus that summer. He subsequently earned an M.A. and M.Phil. in history at Yale University, and completed his Ph.D. there in 1980. A year later, Fr. von Arx received an M.Div. from the Weston School of Theology and was ordained a priest.

Fr. von Arx has served or is currently on the boards of trustees of Boston College, Canisius College, Loyola Marymount University, and Xavier University, as well as the Commission on New England Association of Schools and Colleges. He was appointed to the Fairfield Board in 2002 and as President, continues to serve as a trustee.

A noted scholar and historian, Fr. von Arx is the author of numerous articles as well as the books *Progress and Pessimism: Religion, Politics and History in Late Nineteenth-Century Britain* (Harvard University Press, 1985) and *Varieties of Ultramontanism* (Catholic University Press, 1998).
